Principal's Message

Happy New Year to all NMS and MOHC families. This time of year becomes a chance to refocus our intentions and revisit goals we set for ourselves when the school year started. As a principal, I think a lot about how we can bring new experiences to our students and families. What can we do as a school outside of the exceptional classroom instruction which will be of value to our students? The staff and admin team have lots of irons in the fire for the next few months with experiences that we are excited to share.

The grade 7/8 class registered for the Give it A Shot reading campaign with the Edmonton Oil Kings. They completed their reading logs and were drawn to receive free Oil Kings tickets for the January 19 home game at Roger's Place. Permission forms have gone home for those students. The school is providing the bus. Additional tickets can be purchased for \$20 and there is room on the bus! Contact Ms. Ladret for more information. Great work, grade 7 and 8's!

January 31 there will be a parent presentation with Ariel Haubrich about student mental health. It will be hosted in Two Hills. The Myrnam School Council is looking at having a bus available to transport parents interested in this evening session. Having worked personally with Ariel over the years, and having heard her speak at mental health conferences, she is well worth the time for an evening. More information will be forwarded to parents by email soon.

Mukluk is coming up on February 14. This is the day before Teacher's Convention. Parents interested in helping organize and serve a meal are greatly appreciated. Please give me a call or shoot me an email if you would like to help and can come out on that day. The high school involvement on this day has been dwindling in recent years. Last year, when we had student input on the events we had the best turnout for attendance that I have seen for a long time. We're excited to start that planning with students at the beginning of semester 2.

April 15 Myrnam School will be hosting our own version of the Post Secondary Night hosted in St. Paul in the fall. Post secondary institutions will be on hand in our New Myrnam School gym on that Monday from 9:00 - 10:30 a.m. Students from grade 7-12 will have time to tour the booths and speak to representatives from several universities and colleges in Alberta. We will post the list of institutions attending on the newmyrnamschool.ca website when we have the final list. Parents are welcome to come in and walk around with their student. We have invited other schools in our area to take advantage of this opportunity as well.

Try-a-Trade in Lloydminster is April 30. We have plans to take students from grade 9-12. The advantage of the small school is that we can logistically take them all! Stay tuned for more information as we approach the event.

Students have come to me with ideas of events to attend surrounding themes of climate change. I will be working with the admin team to put together a plan to figure out how to get interested students to those events. Also in the works are Inside Education student conferences and Energy Innovation events, LICA classroom presentations including X-Stream Science where our students will field test a water body around Myrnam, and post secondary field trips beyond the trip to Lakeland College's open house last fall. The school is always buzzing with a new opportunity to open up an experience students may not have otherwise had access to. We will do our best to keep parents informed of these events through the website, newsletter, and emails home.






On the second Friday of each month the Village of Myrnam will host a community movie night in the school gymnasium. Doors will open at 6:00 and the movie will start at 7:00.

EXTREME WEATHER

Is my child's bus running? Coming home early?

Throughout the winter, weather and road conditions are constantly monitored with the safety of students and staff at the center of all of our decisions. We strive to inform parents of any delays or cancellations as quickly as possible. Here's how you may be notified:

- Bus driver contact
- Call/text from your school
- Local radio stations
- Bus Status app

- Division social media (Facebook and Instagram)
- Division website https://www.stpauleducation.ab.ca/transportation/bus-status



How we decide:

When temperatures and/or wind chill is -40 or colder, buses are CANCELLED.


Notice may be given the night before or in the morning.



Buses may run in the afternoon during extreme cold weather under certain circumstances.



Weather checks start very early with The Weather Network and phone calls to designated staff living in each local area.



- If your child attends: meaningful learning still occurs
- If your child is absent: efforts will be made to ensure they do not fall behind



If a decision is required around temperature and/or road conditions, the Director of Transportation consults with:

- Local bus drivers
- School principals
- Superintendent of Schools



Decision is based on:

- Local road conditions
- RCMP travel advisories
- · Weather and wind warnings
- · Local municipality

Your bus driver also has complete discretion to cancel a route should they feel travel is unsafe.



Parents always have the final say about their child's safety and well-being and can always choose whether or not to have their child take the bus.



The Nations of Saddle Lake, Whitefish Lake and Frog Lake make independent decisions about their buses.

Please contact them directly for any questions regarding their transportation policies.

HOW SICK IS TOO SICK FOR SCHOOL?



SEND TO SCHOOL

- A runny nose or just a little cough but no other symptoms.
- Sore throat but no other symptoms.
- No fever in the past 24 hours without fever-reducing medicine.
- No vomiting or diarrhea for 24 hours.



KEEP AT HOME

- Fever higher than 100.4 degrees F (38 degrees C).
- Sore throat, with other symptoms such as a persistent cough.
- Vomiting or diarrhea in the past 24 hours.
- Eyes are pink and crusty.
- Has been exposed to an illness where isolation is recommended.









SchoolMessenger Mass Notifications System Information for Parents

What is SchoolMessenger?

SchoolMessenger is a mass notification system used to deliver information to families. These mass notifications are referred to as 'Broadcasts' due to SchoolMessenger's capability to simultaneously send messages to a vast number of destinations. Available broadcast destinations include phone, email, and SMS text.

Message recipients' contact data for parents comes from the PowerSchool Student Information System (SIS) database. This data is updated every evening so that any changes to phone numbers, emails and contact preferences will be current on every broadcast.

During phase one of implementation, the Division will begin using SchoolMessenger to communicate information to parents and guardians about safety alerts and school closures. Schools may also use this tool to share newsletters and information about special events and activities. Phase two, which includes activating the attendance reporting feature 'Safe Arrival', is expected to begin in early 2024.

Phone Messages



- Phone calls will be reserved for emergencies such as safety alerts or early dismissal due to inclement weather.
- Phone calls will be sent as an automated message (computerized or human voice) and will come from the school phone number.
- In addition to a phone call, text and email messages will also be sent in emergency situations.

Email Messages



 School newsletters and information about fundraising, hot lunch programs and other school activities will be shared via email.

Additional Information

- Existing school-to-home communication tools currently used by classroom teachers (e.g. Seesaw, ClassDojo) may still be utilized.
- Schools will have flexibility in how they use SchoolMessenger. Stay tuned to your schools website and social media to learn more about how this new tool will be used at your child's school.
- All messages can also be viewed on the SchoolMessenger app. Parents are not required to download the app at this time, however, the Division will be asking all families to download the app when we move forward with the SchoolMessenger attendance reporting feature 'Safe Arrival'.
- Parents have the option to request that additional contacts, such as a child care provider, receive text and email messages from their child's school. Please call the school to make this request or if you have any questions about SchoolMessenger.

Text Messages



- In addition to being used for emergencies, your school may also use text messages to communicate important information regarding sports and other after-school activities, field trip delays, etc.
- Under federal law originally designed to protect consumers from telemarketers, we have to get your permission to send messages to a mobile phone by SMS text. It is also just a good idea so that we're sure that message is going to the right phone number for the right person. Therefore, to receive texts you will need to opt-in.
- On **October 18, 2023** an opt-in invitation text to participate in this free service* will be sent to mobile phone numbers of all primary contacts uploaded from our Student Information System (SIS). Recipients have to reply 'Y' or 'Yes' to the invitation text message to 'opt-in'.



 If you did not receive the invitation text message or want to ensure you are registered, you can simply send a text message as follows:

To Opt-In: Text 'Y' or 'Yes' to our short code number (978338)


