

Showcase was one day for the public to get a glimpse of what we do the other 179. Thank you for showing your support for the students by giving us

your most valuable resource; your time.

I am so incredibly proud of our students and staff for the work they put in every single day. Those daily habits turn into successful completion of curricular outcomes. More importantly, daily habits turn into success in learning to problem solve, think critically, collaborate, and be creative. The staff of NMS and MOHC are so integral to creating environments where students can have the freedom to take risks and learn from their mistakes in a safe space. There is so much more to come from these kids. They have no limits and can accomplish anything.

May means spring and spring means....field trip season! Teachers are excitedly planning field trips for grade 1/2, 3-6, 7/8, and 9-12. Stay tuned for permission forms and information letters coming soon.

April has come and gone and what a month it has been!!



ECS have started reading books about spring. They had the opportunity to play and learn on Osmo, Smartbuilders, Lego and blocks. They made tons of different paper flowers which are now housed in the showcase in the foyer. We've started learning about gardening and will be planting a couple seeds and continue to work on Education.com

Grade 1/2 are still working on mastering logging into accelerated reader and taking the AR quizzes. This will be ongoing until the end of the year. They too had the opportunity to play and learn on Osmo, Smartbuilders, Lego and blocks. They will also be learning about gardening and will be planting a couple seeds. They will continue to work on education.com as well.

Grades 3 - 6 continue to work on their AR goals which last until the end of the school year. Osmo, Smartbuilders, Lego and blocks were a hit when they were using them. They will continue to learn how to use some of the eresources that the library has to offer free with their library cards and practice ordering books online. They are also reading more non fiction books.

So far this year 1,209 AR quizzes have been taken, 1,184 were 85% or higher and 12,977,439 words have been read. Such beautiful numbers!!!

Showcase was a hit. I brought in numerous makers space items for visitors to use. There appeared to almost always have a lineup to use the Osmo, and Oculus Meta Quest 2 VR Headsets. The shareable items, Smart Builders, Lego and blocks were rarely idle. I also brought in a button maker which was such a success I ran out of buttons!!




From worldwide bestselling author and artist Dav Pilkey comes Dog Man, the canine cop who's part dog, part man, and ALL HERO!




Join Pete the Kitty as he learns to wash his hands in this new I Can Read story from New York Times bestselling creators Kimberly and James Dean!

Pete must wash his hands many times a day. He must wash them after he sneezes, coughs, plays with his friends, eats his food, and throws away his trash.


Beginning readers will love learning how to wash their hands with Pete!





SEND TO SCHOOL

- A runny nose or just a little cough but no other symptoms.
- Sore throat but no other symptoms.
- No fever in the past 24 hours without fever-reducing medicine.
- No vomiting or diarrhea for 24 hours.



KEEP AT HOME

- Fever higher than 100.4 degrees F (38 degrees C).
- Sore throat, with other symptoms such as a persistent cough.
- Vomiting or diarrhea in the past 24 hours.
- Eyes are pink and crusty.
- Has been exposed to an illness where isolation is recommended.
