June 12, 2024 BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS



Education Plan and Budget

The Board of Trustees has approved its Education Plan and a \$58,407,702 balanced budget for the 2024-25 school year. Due to inflation, flat provincial funding and declining enrollment, balancing the budget required reducing expenses as using reserves was not an option as these have been depleted over seven years of deficits. The Board explored various cost-saving measures, leading to necessary staffing adjustments managed primarily through transfers and attrition, ensuring minimal impact on class sizes. Strategic hires were made to advance educational goals, focusing on supporting the learning of students and teachers, as well as staff and student wellness. The budget, based on uncertain enrollment figures and undetermined wage increases, aims to balance immediate needs with long-term sustainability, prioritizing student achievement, technology upgrades, and staff development. Mallaig School Design Process

A four-week pause has been requested for the design phase of the proposed new school in Mallaig to assess the inclusion of space for a daycare. The design process will resume on July 2, 2024.

Student Engagement

The Board will continue its discussions on engaging students in identifying topics of interest to both the Board and students, as well as highlighting school achievements.

Wellness Survey

In May, students and staff participated in a wellness survey. The survey questions addressed various aspects of overall mental, physical, and social-emotional well-being. Initial findings for students highlight nutrition, sleep, technology use, anxiety, and their sense of connection at school. For staff, the survey themes focused on work-life balance, occupational stress and financial stress. Overall, staff expressed satisfaction with their workplace. This data will inform and guide wellness initiatives within the Division and schools.

Terry Fox Foundation

École Mallaig School was recognized by the Terry Fox Foundation for ranking as the 20th top fundraising school in Alberta, raising an impressive \$5,726 last year.

Division Pow Wow

The Traditional School Division Pow Wow, held on May 30th, was a remarkable event showcasing the talents of dancers from local schools.
